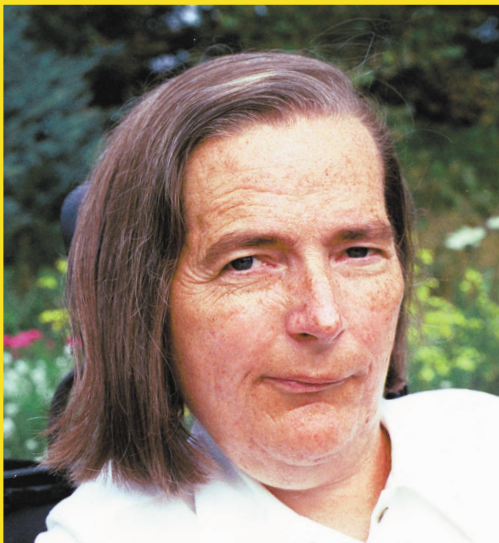

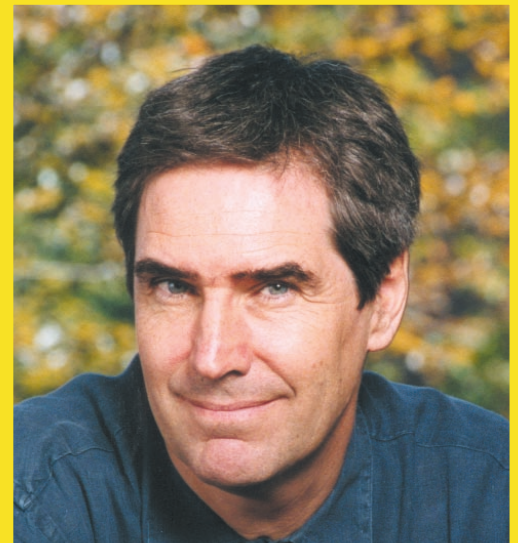


Catherine Frazee
